## INTER-ORGANIZATION COORDINATING COMMITTEE (IOCC)

## SUMMARY RECORD OF THE 58<sup>th</sup> MEETING 17-18 October 2022, OECD, Paris

The 58<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Inter-Organization Coordinating Committee (IOCC) of the IOMC was held 17-18 October 2022, hosted by OECD in Paris. Ms. Gabi Eigenmann (UNIDO) chaired the meeting. The meeting discussed, *inter alia*, IOMC indicators of progress, strategic interests of POs and IOMC collectively including coordination issues, SAICM and Beyond 2020, the negotiations for a science-policy panel (SPP) and for an international instrument on plastic pollution, the IOMC Toolbox, as well as holding a discussion with the GEF secretariat.

## Specific Matters

The SAICM secretariat presented an update on the Beyond 2020 process and the IOMC agreed to hold the next **workshop on the integrated approach** (focusing on dimension two: "integrating chemicals and waste management in industry sectors and product value chains") in January 2023 and a webinar on **indicators** in February 2023, as well as undertake a consultation with the IP Co-Chairs before the end of 2022.

IOMC held a **strategic discussion** on: preparations for IP-4.2, the negotiations for a science-policy panel (including agreement to hold an IOMC coordination call before OEWG-1.2 at the end of January 2023), and the upcoming negotiations for a legally-binding instrument on plastics (INC-1 taking place at the end of November 2022).

A discussion with the GEF secretariat was held to update on progress with **GEF-8** and consider how proposals related to SAICM might be submitted.

IOMC further progressed the discussion about BRS membership in IOMC with the aim to have concrete progress by the time of the May 2023 COPs.

## **General Matters**

Several organizations and convention secretariats reported on recent or upcoming **governing body** meetings and participants also shared information about on-going and new initiatives.

A progress report on the **IOMC Toolbox** was provided and participants informed that the proposal for the next phase had been submitted.
